The Golf Course

Established in 1951, the Cranbrook golf course is a mature, 18-hole layout that offers an exceptional golfing experience.

Blessed with the most hours of sunshine in all of BC, Cranbrook enjoys an early start (Beginning of April / End of March) and outstanding weather throughout the season. In prime season (July and August) we have, almost without fail, long, sunny days with little wind - ideal weather for golfing.

Cranbrook always offers outstanding course conditions. Our favourable climate and ample water supply along with first rate maintenance make for top playing conditions from start to finish of the season. Our greens are our special pride; they are speedy, true, soft and a joy to play.

If you don't like waiting to play, you'll love Cranbrook. We have a very efficient layout where a four hour round is the norm. We're also an easy walk. If you prefer to ride, you'll be able to drive up to your ball.

As testimony to our merit, we point to the number of major amateur championships held at Cranbrook. Six in total including the 2004 RCGA National Match Play Championship. *A championship course in its true sense.*

Our course is a mature parkland layout that plays from 5200 to 6800 yards offering challenge and enjoyment to golfers at all levels. We can be easy, we can be tough, the choice is yours, but we are always a pleasant experience. Each hole, beautifully framed in tall evergreens, affords a quiet dignity that feels quite special and invites you to play.

Member Golf Events

The Club holds a number of golf events for members throughout the season. The pivotal event is the Club Championship held in August each year when the course is in prime condition and everyone's game is in well-practiced form (hopefully). We also have Men's and Ladies' Opening and Closing tournaments as well as other member-based events throughout the season. There are reserved blocks of time each week throughout the season for Men's Night and a Ladies' Day/Night.

Availability of Play

The Club looks to maintain a sensible balance between tournament play and open play so that different interests are reasonably accommodated. Our club economics also require adequate opportunity for green fee play. In the end, the member gets access to the majority of the tee sheet and the club tries to supplement the remaining tee times with outside play.

Member Benefits

Being a member of the Cranbrook Golf Club has a number of benefits. Whether you want to play a few holes after work or a full 18, the club is conveniently located and the layout of holes allows you to quit near the clubhouse at several points. The Golf Shop is very flexible and will do what they can to accommodate your schedule. You can even keep track of your rounds and handicap on the club's licensed Handicap computer. If you enjoy playing other courses as well, members receive discounted green fee rates at a number of courses in the surrounding area (see below). Membership Categories and Conditions

Regular Adults

- 1. Available to persons aged 19 and older.
- 2. Full playing privileges no restrictions.
- 3. May be accompanied by a Student or Junior under certain conditions (see Student and Junior).
- 4. Voting eligibility.

Seniors

- 1. Available to persons aged 65 and older (As of April 1st of the year of the membership)
- 2. Full playing privileges no restrictions.
- 3. Voting eligibility.

9 Hole Membership

- 1. Provides for one round of 9 holes on any day during the season
- 2. Additional 9 holes on same day for a special green fee (noted after Golf Services).
- 3. May not start before 1:00 pm on weekends and holidays.
- 4. Available to persons aged 19 and older.
- 5. Not eligible to vote.

Limited Play

- 1. Members receive a punch card, valid for the current year's golf season only, that entitles the member to 10 eighteen-hole rounds or 20 nine-hole rounds or any combination thereof.
- 2. Membership includes charging privileges at Clubhouse and Golf Shop, Golf Association membership, reciprocal rates from participating golf courses, eligibility to enter all club tournaments and events, discounted green fees for guests and use of the handicap computer.
- 3. May be upgraded to a full membership, at any point of the season with full credit given for the Limited Play Membership expenditure. No service charge is applied. No credit is given for Green Fee Book of Ten expenditures.
- 4. If not upgraded, additional rounds may be purchased under green fee options such as the Green Fee Book of Ten. Green fee expenditures are not credited towards upgrades.
- 5. Not eligible to vote
- 6. Available to persons aged 19 and older.

Intermediates

- 1. Available to persons aged 19 to 30.
- 2. No playing Restrictions
- 3. Not eligible to vote.

Students

- 1. Available to persons aged 19 to 25.
- 2. Must be attending a post-secondary educational institution and enrolled in a minimum of 15 course-hours per week.
- 3. May not start before 1:00 pm on weekends or holidays. Individual conflicts with work will be taken into consideration.
- 4. Not eligible to vote.

Juniors

- 1. Available to persons aged 10 to 18.
- 2. An *Affiliated Junior* must have a parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle, brother or sister who is a Regular Adult member.
- 3. A *Sponsored Junior* must have a guardian who has completed a *Junior Sponsorship Agreement*.
- 4. On weekends or holidays, may start before 1:00 PM when playing with a Regular Adult member.
- 5. On Monday, Thursday or Friday, may not start between 4:30 pm and 6:30 pm.

- 6. On Men's Night (Wednesday), may not start between 1:00 pm and 6:30 pm and may not use putting or chipping greens between 1:00 pm and 5:00 pm.
- 7. On Ladies' Night (Tuesday), may not start between 3:00 pm and 6:30 pm
- 8. Initiation Fee not required and not eligible to vote.

General Rules

Six People

- All players must register/check in at the Pro Shop prior to play. Failure to check in and register 5 minutes prior to a reserved starting time may result in cancellation or set back.
- Metal spiked shoes are not allowed.
- Footwear that is damaging to the greens (soccer or football shoes, boots/shoes with deep treads etc) is not allowed.
- Each player must have their own set of golf clubs.
- Players use the golf course and driving range at their own risk and are subject to the rules and regulations of the Cranbrook Golf Club.

Dress Code

The Cranbrook Golf Club has implemented a Dress Code to establish a reasonable standard for attire that applies to all patrons and is in keeping with the traditions of our game.

- 1. Slacks, corduroys or denim jeans are acceptable. Shorts must be hemmed, have pockets and be mid-thigh or longer. Ladies' culottes, skorts and skirts fall under this same regulation. Sweat pants, tattered or torn leg wear and cut-offs are not allowed.
- 2. Shirts with collars are preferred but not mandatory. Tank tops or halter tops with less than three-inch straps are not acceptable.
- 3. Long sleeve sports jerseys (hockey, baseball, football, etc.) including collar-less hockey or soccer shirts are not allowed.

The dress code applies to both the golf course and the driving range. The Clubhouse allows golf attire, business attire and acceptable "summer" dress.

The Dress Code will be enforced by Golf Shop and Clubhouse staff.

Note to members: Please ensure that your guests are aware of and abide by dress requirements.

Play of Course

- Do <u>not</u> wave up following players on *par 3 holes*.
- Players are asked to <u>not *fish for balls*</u> in the pond on #8. Players should, of course, retrieve their own balls during play and assist others in their group, but for the benefit of all golfers, the Club would like to limit the retrieval of balls to those circumstances.

Etiquette

- All players should conduct themselves in a disciplined manner, demonstrating courtesy and sportsmanship at all times. This is the spirit of the game of golf.
- Players must not play until the players in front are out of range.

Pace of Play

The purpose of a pace of play policy is to ensure that all members and guests can enjoy a round of golf in an acceptable time.

- Your unimpeded playing time for 18 holes should be 4 hours.
- When there's a group ahead, it is your group's responsibility to either finish play in 4 hours or keep up to the group in front if the pace is slower.
- If your group does not keep up with this pace of play, your group should either speed up its pace, or allow following groups to play through safely.
- We encourage *ready golf*: get ready to play; play when ready and safe.
- Do not waste time. Players should anticipate the club or clubs they may need and go directly to their ball to play promptly when it is their turn. If a player is delayed in making their shot, they should indicate to another player to play out of turn.

- The time taken on greens is often a chief cause of slow play. Players should be ready to putt when it is their turn and should study and clear their line of their putt while others are doing the same.
- Your maximum number of strokes per hole should be four over par. At that point, pick up your ball. (Tournaments are an exception.)
- <u>No</u> group has the *right to play through*. Groups should maintain their position on the golf course without pressuring those in front. Smaller groups should not expect to play through.

Care of Course

- **Repair ball marks** on greens.
- The preferred method of repairing **divots** on our fairways is to fill divot holes with divot fill mix, and discard divots into the trees. Divot fill is available at various points on the course. Failing this, replace divots to their original position and press them to the ground as flat as possible.
- Rake bunkers and place rakes in bunkers close and parallel to edge, aligned in the direction of play.

Use of Riding Carts

- Obey all cart signs.
- Keep riding carts off of the tee areas.
- Riding carts are not allowed within the lines or markers prohibiting the entry of carts, or in the absence of such, within 30 feet of the putting greens.
- Riding carts must be parked on the cart paths while using greens and tees.
- Between tee and green, stay on the cart paths and utilize the 90 degree rule to leave and return. After cart paths end, it's intended that you drive to your ball. Avoid driving on ground under repair and worn areas.
- Any breach of these rules could lead to the suspension of the riding cart privileges or suspension from membership at the course.

Local Rules

- *Distance Measuring Devices* devices with this single functionality may be used. Use of a device with the ability to measure other conditions that might affect play (e.g., gradient, wind-speed, temperature, etc.), is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether this additional functionality is actually used.
- **150 yard boulder markers:** <u>immovable obstructions</u>. *Relief for interference to stance or swing path only one club length from nearest point of relief, no closer to hole.*
- Paved or unpaved roads/paths, paved curbs and artificial surfaces (e.g., bark mulch): <u>immovable</u> <u>obstructions</u>.
- *Garden areas* includes all flower beds (with or without flowers) and hedges throughout the course: ground <u>under repair</u>. *Relief for interference to stance or swing path only one club length from nearest point of relief, no closer to hole.*
- *Bunkers.* Stones interfering with the safety of your shot from any sand trap may be deemed <u>movable</u> <u>obstructions</u>.
- *French drains* (gravel can be seen or felt by probing), trenches filled with gravel or the like are ground under repair even though not so marked.
- *Railway ties on hole #17* form part of the hazard and are an integral part of the course (<u>not</u> an immoveable obstruction).
- *Clubhouse parking lot*, *in its entirety*, including fenced area for staff parking: <u>out of bounds</u>.
- *Clubhouse area* includes the area behind #10 tee and #18 green: from cart path behind #18 green to the clubhouse and from line of cart path extended to the scoreboard area down to the parking lot fence. Also includes immediate area of putting green. Free drop at nearest designated drop area.

Refunds

Full or partial refunds of annual memberships are considered only in the event of illness, injury or involuntary relocation from the Cranbrook area. Requests due to voluntary relocation, inability to play sufficient rounds or a personal decision not to play will <u>not</u> be considered.

Applications for refund must be made in writing to CGC to the attention of the Director for Membership who must grant approval. At the discretion of the CGC, requests for refunds may be granted as a refund or a member credit and amounts granted will be pro-rated as follows:

Procedure

Refunds are determined based upon the date of refund request.

The amount of refund applies only to the Membership Fee and Water Assessment portions of the Gross Amount i.e., BCGA Dues are not refundable.

The following schedule indicates the *maximum* amount of *refund* that will be considered.
